LABOR DAY FUN FACTS



1. It's always a Monday
Labor Day lands on the first Monday in September, that's by design, giving everyone a guaranteed three-day weekend.
 2. The first big celebration was in NYC (1882)
On September 5, 1882, about 10,000 workers marched in New York City to demand better working conditions.
 3. Oregon went first
Oregon was the first state to make Labor Day official, back in 1887.
 4. It became a federal holiday in 1894
President Grover Cleveland signed the law on June 28, 1894, making it official nationwide.
 5. Who "invented" it? Two guys with almost the same name. Historians still debate: was it Peter J. McGuire or Matthew Maguire? Both were involved in that first NYC parade.
 6. Parades + parties were part of the plan
The earliest celebrations called for a street parade, then a festival, which is pretty much how many people celebrate today.
 7. There was also a "Labor Sunday"
In 1909, the American Federation of Labor suggested the Sunday before Labor Day for the movement's "spiritual and educational" side.
 8. It's the "unofficial end of summer"
The holiday is seen as the symbolic end of summer; parades, barbecues, and ball games make it one of the season's last big hurrahs.
 9. "No wearing white after Labor Day"? Outdated
The fashion "rule" goes back to old social norms, but today it's more myth than mandate.
 10. Canada celebrates too
In the U.S. and Canada, Labor Day/Labour Day falls on the first Monday in September; many other countries honor workers on May 1.
- Bonus Fact: Pop Culture Throwback
The MDA "Jerry Lewis" Telethon ran every Labor Day weekend for decades, raising billions for charity.

Skip, (his mother gave him that nickname when he was a baby), was born on July 15, 1939, to Marion & Roland White.

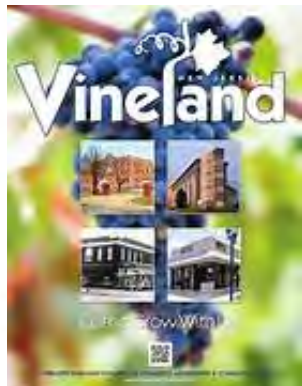
He was born in Vineland, New Jersey and moved to Florida in 2001, to be closer to his younger sister Pat & his children.

GRANDPARENTS DAY FUN FACTS

Grandparents Day was the brainchild of Marian McQuade of Fayette County, W.Va., who hoped to persuade grandchildren to tap the wisdom and heritage of their grandparents.

The first presidential proclamation was issued in 1978, and one has been issued each year since then designating the first Sunday after Labor Day as National Grandparents Day.

Today, the forget-me-not is the official flower of Grandparents Day, and "A Song for Grandma and Grandpa" written in 2004 by composer Johnny Prill has become the day's official anthem. The average age of a U.S. grandparent is 48, and more than half are baby boomers.

According to US Census data, one in three adults will be a grandparent in the year 2020.

Economic conditions have also cast some American grandparents as a main economic support and roles as primary caregivers for their families :

There are over 70 million grandparents in the United States today!

7 million - Number of grandparents who live with any of their grandchildren under 18. Most of these grandparents (4.5 million) maintain their own household.

2.7 million - Number of grandparents responsible for most of the basic needs (i.e., food, shelter, clothing) of one or more of the grandchildren they live with. These grandparents represent 43 percent of all grandparents who live with their grandchildren. Of these caregivers, 1.5 million are grandmothers and 900,000, grandfathers.

1.7 million - Number of grandparents who are in the labor force and simultaneously responsible for most of the basic needs of their grandchildren.

Grandparents love to spend money on their grandchildren. *According to an AARP report, 40% of grandparents spend over \$500 on their grandkids in twelve months. While most of this is on holidays and birthdays, grandparents are also helping with education costs, medical or dental bills, and everyday living costs.

Grandparents stay close to their grandchildren. 69% of grandparents live within 50 miles of their grandchildren. When grandparents do live a considerable distance away, they make sure they see their grandkids. 43% have traveled over 200 miles to see their grandchildren.

58% of grandparents say they talk to their grandchild at least once a week. Grandchildren are coming to their grandparents for advice now more than ever.

Samuel S. Mast of Pennsylvania holds the record for having the most living descendants. He passed away in 1992, but he fathered 11 children, 97 grandchildren, 634 great-grandchildren and 82 great-great-grandchildren. That's a big family!

Barack Obama and Oprah Winfrey were raised by their grandparents. Talk about good influences! Many celebrities have become grandparents at a young age. Loretta Lynn became a grandparent at age 29 and CeeLo Green at age 35.

Of the twenty women in the state Senate, half of them are grandmothers.

Grandparents are becoming more tech savvy; more than half are on social media sites and share photos online.

More than half of grandparents play video games with their grandchildren. Now the kids are the teachers! Slightly more than 10% of grandparents have tattoos. Can you imagine what this number will be when the twenty-somethings of today are grandparents?

Between 2015 and 2050, the proportion of the world's population who is over 60 will nearly double from 12% to 22%.

As of 2020, the number of people aged 60 and over outnumber children younger than 5.

In 2050, 80% of older people will be living in low- and middle-income countries.

The pace of population aging is much faster than in the past.

All countries face major challenges to ensure that their health and social systems are ready to cater for this demographic shift.
